# Telling Others

- (ii) His Conversion – verses 12-18. We see how he met Jesus.
- (iii) His Change – verses 19-23. We see how Jesus changed Him.
- (iv) His Challenge – verse 27. We see that he showed others they also needed Jesus.

### In Sharing Your Testimony.

- Make it personal—don't preach. Tell what Christ has done for you.
- Make it short. 100 words should be enough. People don't want to listen for long.
- KEEP Christ central. A good testimony always highlights what He has done.
- Use the Word of God. A verse or two of scripture will add power to your testimony.

Remember—the Word of God has a keen cutting edge.
